Fire Chief Report July 2018

As you are aware, we sent a Columbia County task force to the Substation Fire near The Dalles, and then to the Mendocino Complex fire near Ukiah in California. The state of Oregon called back the task forces from California due to the increased fire threats in Oregon. Chief O'Connor, Chief Coombs, Chief Pricher, Captain Gorsuch, and Lt Nielson are on different incident management teams and have been sent to several fires over the last two months.

I am still meeting with members of both districts gathering information on what is working and not working with the intergovernmental agreement. We are getting ready to hire Paramedics only personnel for both districts shortly. CRFR has hired a mechanic to replace Duane Jordon who will be moving to Idaho in September.

Ambulance cost

A request for a detailed cost for an ambulance, equipment and supplies was made at July's Board meeting. Once outfitted with fixed equipment, the vehicle total is \$177,057. Once stocked with removable equipment and consumable supplies, the grand total comes to \$245,410.80. An itemized cost has been provided in DropBox for review.

Community Paramedic

There are currently 32 active clients enrolled in the program and have served 90 overall. We have customized the community health module of ImageTrend based on input from our community paramedic and CareOregon. Nina will receive detailed training August 13th.

Single role paramedic

Applications for the single role paramedic closed on July 20th. We received 16 applications. Two did not pass screening. Three declined or cancelled an interview. Initial interviews and physical abilities test will be conducted on August 3. The top five candidates will be invited to a chief's interview on August 10th. We intend to have their initial training begin in September.

July 2018 – Chief of Operations Monthly Report

July: its hot, dry, and we have received little to no precipitation. The County and our District(s) have seen a number of natural cover fires, most small to medium size in nature, suppressed quickly or within a few hours. We are seeing fuel, both live and dead in conditions we normally do not see to late August. Our call volume is trending back up as citizens go out and work in the warm conditions.

Oregon State Fire Marshal's Office has had a number of Conflagration requests, during the month of July and early August Columbia County sent Task Forces to the Substation Fire in the Dalles and to the Mendocino Complex in Northern California. Both Task Forces have returned but we have a number of Administrative Staff and Line Officers on Incident Management Teams that are currently deployed to fires in Southern Oregon and Northern Washington. The current long range weather forecast does not show any relief till mid-September or early October.

This month we conducted a number of hiring interviews/testing. We have moved forward with Fire Apparatus Mechanic hiring and Ambulance Only Paramedic positions. Anticipation for starting or filling vacant positions will be later in the month of August and early September.

Image Trend is proceeding; we have closed more gaps and improved the process as we work with FF Tim Hennigan, FF Jeff Lockhart, and Lt Jim Pulito. Chief Coombs and I cannot thank Tim, Jeff, and Jim enough for their efforts to complete this project.

Finally, reports on our run totals, types, and numbers is still in process. We are working with Image Trend Report Writer to obtain that information. When we have it up you will see response data again.

- Budget Items The 2018/19 budget has been approved and is currently beginning July 1, any purchases planned will be completed this fall when tax revenue begins arriving.
- Ambulance Only personnel continue to finish up the FTEP (Field Training Component) and we have seen a few more become eligible to operate in the field. We have started the process for hiring full time EMS only Paramedics for both SRFD and CRFR. We are accepting applications and plan on interview/testing later in July and early August.
- CRFR has flown the announcement for the Fleet Maintenance positions. We have received a number of applications and are currently evaluating the potential candidates. Interviews were conducted, a tentative job offer has been given, waiting for physical and background. Rick Fletcher is off on OJI, he will be returning to light duty in the coming weeks. Duane Jordan plans on working into mid-September, we wish him and his family the best of luck on their new adventure in Idaho.

- CAD We are working on continued CAD issues, they are becoming less frequent and those that do arise are being quickly handled by CCOM staff. Mike Fletcher has taken the reigns of CCOM and is updating and improving their systems daily.
- Wildland/Conflagration response reimbursement: CRFR has received reimbursement for the North California Conflag response for Oct 2017. The only remaining conflag reimbursement still pending for both SRFD and CRFR is for the Thomas fire in December 2017. Most likely we should see payment in the early portion of summer. At this time we have not received payment for the Thomas Fire.

LENGTH OF SERVICE AWARD PLAN

The Board of Directors agrees to provide funding if available for an Oregon Fire District Directors Association Length of Service Award Plan (LSAP) for members in good standing with the District. Members must meet the requirement set by the Scappoose Volunteer Firefighters Association (SVFA). Funding availability is solely determined by the District.

For a volunteer member to be in good standing with the District for LSAP, they have to provide a minimum of one hundred and fifty (150) hours in a calendar year to be considered eligible for the LSAP program for that year. The hours may be earned through activities sponsored or approved by the District, including responding to fire, emergency medical or other requests for emergency response, training, instructing, public education programs, approved District meetings, administrative duties and other functions approved by the District.

The District will distribute funds once a year between February and May to SDAO LSAP once the volunteers have been certified as eligible members by SVFA for the prior year's service.
