REGULAR MEETING OF THE SCAPPOOSE RURAL FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT BOARD OF DIRECTORS, AT 7 P.M., THURSDAY, APRIL 12, 2018, SCAPPOOSE FIRE STATION, SCAPPOOSE, OREGON.

(Note: The volume on the audio recording was much lower than usual, making it difficult to hear many of the discussions. While all actions are recorded, there are fewer comments.)

CALL TO ORDER: President Grant called the board meeting to order at 7:02 p.m. Mr.

Cairns led the room in the flag salute.

AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION – None

CONSENT: President Grant opened discussion on the consent agenda items. Mr. Graham moved and Mr. Krieck seconded approving the consent agenda. Mr. Krieck asked about the volunteer coordinator check. Ms. Salisbury explained that CRF&R is the employer and pays all of the salary and benefits. Scappoose reimburses CRF&R 50% of the coordinator's salary and benefits on a monthly basis.

Motion to approve the consent agenda carried unanimously.

CHIEF REPORTS:

Safety Meeting Minutes (March & April) – Note was made of the need to use backers.

March Alarm Report: Chief Pricher observed that the number of calls per day is increasing. Furthermore, the calls by time of day are fairly consistent. These trends support the decision to hire single role EMS staff during peak call hours.

2017 Alarm Report: Chief Greisen noted that this report indicates a steady increase in the annual call volume over the last eight years, with the sole exception of 2013.

Chief's Report: The new CAD system is up and running for 911. It is a major change for both dispatchers and responders. The iPads are not working very well, but the new apps are supposed to be out soon and we'll see if that helps. We have 5 months to wait before we can make changes (unless there is an emergency).

Operations: Chief Coombs discussed ImageTrend. We are working on the patient care to

make sure that it flows in a way that meets our needs. The program is highly customizable. Columbia River went live on Wednesday. Chief Marks said that he attended a fire in St. Helens and was able to return directly to Scappoose to prepare the report because Scappoose used to use ImageTrend. Previously he would have had to prepare it at Columbia River.

Cheryl Engstrom, Misty Holsey, and Kelsey were trained on the billing section of ImageTrend and were impressed with it.

EMS Report: No comments.

Training: (inaudible)

Safety & Resource Management: Chief Greisen and the Board discussed various options for the proposed security system in Scappoose.

Chief Greisen said that the new CAD system has required much additional staff time and many meetings with 911.

Mr. Krieck asked about the reason for differences in subdivision design. Chief Pricher said that the city and fire district are working together very well. The developers are getting creative and pushing the design limits to maximize buildable land. Sometimes there are temporary code waivers when it is clear that adjacent land will also be developed. For example, subsequent development can turn a dead-end into a through street.

Miscellaneous – The new 911 director is Michael Fletcher. He started a little late because he stayed in his former position at Washington County to help bring on the new 911 CAD system.

There will be a 911 Advisory Meeting soon. These are held quarterly. AT&T is presenting their FirstNet system which is required by federal contract to provide extensive radio and cell phone coverage nationwide. The new system will give cell and internet service priority to emergency responders.

OLD BUSINESS: Committee Reports & Other Items

- A. Awards & Incentives Committee No meeting.
- **B.** Management Team Committee Mr. Cairns reported that they met before the meeting and discussed the fire chief job classification system.
- **C.** Planning Committee The meeting was cancelled.
- **D.** Budget Discussion Ms. Salisbury reported that there was enough revenue after regular expenses to use \$250,000 for special purposes such as a transfer to the property reserve fund to buy equipment.

NEW BUSINESS - New 457 Plan vendor: Ms. Salisbury said 8 staff members attended the introductory meeting with Sara Rohne-Tanner with Foresters Financial. Staff were impressed with her presentation and interested in the possibility of working with Foresters. The Oregon Savings Growth Plan provides financial education, but cannot provide advice. Foresters Financial can provide financial advice for those who are interested. Mr.

Sorenson moved to authorize the new 457 Plan vendor, Foresters Financial Services. The motion was seconded by Mr. Cairns.

The motion carried unanimously.

AUDIENCE: No comments.

GOOD OF THE ORDER: Mr. Grant asked the chiefs in attendance for questions. Chief Pricher asked for Mr. Grant's vision for the fire district. President Grant said his vision is to make the IGA work, to improve the operational efficiencies that we are starting to see, and to have those efficiencies expand countywide. He would also like to assure that staff are fully equipped and well-trained so they can perform their dangerous jobs as safely as possible.

Chief Coombs asked when the consultant would perform the survey. Chief Nye has been ill and not available to discuss the project. CRF&R President Hans Feige wants to have a complete list of goals and objectives before hiring. Chief Greisen said perhaps Chief Nye could come to a joint meeting of the two Boards between 5 and 7 p.m. The District could offer to pay for a hotel room so that he doesn't have to drive home at night.

At their prior joint meeting, the Boards planned to have their next meeting in late April.

ADJOURNMENT: Mr. Krieck moved to close the meeting, Mr. Cairns seconded, and the motion passed unanimously. President Grant adjourned the meeting at 7:53 p.m.




Incidents by Hour for Date Range








Heat Map of all calls Scappoose Fire responded to in 2017

Incidents By Year for Year Range








NUMBER OF RESPONSES BY EACH VEHICLE





CALLS BY TIME OF DAY







March 2018 – Chief of Operations Monthly Report

- Image Trend, the High Plains replacement for our emergency reporting system is in process. Training is currently taking place on shift. FF Jeff Lockhart and FF Tim Hennigan are working to train our career staff and EMS only personnel. Training for volunteers will take place in the month of April. We have pushed the Go Live date to April 11, 2018 due to technical issues between Image Trend and Tri-Tech.
- Crew Sense, another aspect of High Plains that deals with Personnel Rosters, vacation, sick leave, overtime, and general time accounting also is in process. Finance has paid for the Crew Sense subscription, crew rosters have been built. Training the officers and A/L's is the next step in the process. Working with Local 3215 to develop call back and overtime selection procedures. Update: Local 3215 is working with Crew Sense on the OT call back permissions and procedures.
- Budget Items Operations has submitted requests for items in the 2018/19 budget, some items such as Personal Protective Equipment, hose, saws, wildland equipment, and other items have been placed into the budget as a request(s).
- Ambulance Only personnel are currently completing their Field Training Program component per Chief Coombs. This process is dependent upon the individual training with the crews and learning the aspects of the job. It will vary between individuals on how fast they complete the process.
- CAD development: CAD and the new Tri-Tech system are working to varying degrees
 of success. We are working to correct issues as the y appear with Tri-Tech and CCOM
 personnel.
- Wildland/Conflagration response reimbursement: This year's wildland/mutual aid
 response was large and lengthy. We have begun billing for our equipment and manpower
 to the State. It is the goal of the Administration to re-invest these funds into needed
 equipment, supplies, and items that would ultimately come from the general fund in
 some form or another. When we begin to receive our reimbursement we will present our
 options to the Fire Chief and Board for considerations.

EMS Office Activity

Our first group of part-time single role EMS personnel began in March. They received four days of orientation training prior to beginning the Field Training Evaluation Program (FTEP.) Experience ranges from a newly licensed EMT to a paramedic that has worked several years on a 911 ambulance.

CRFR line personnel have begun working with the ImageTrend. Feedback has been very positive. We have received several suggestions from the crews and made a number changes to the patient care report based on input. The CAD/ImageTrend link is now active and CCOM has been involved to assure information is properly 'mapped.' Training for billing personnel is underway and we have been working on exporting information to billing software. We are also confirming that our data meets all state EMS reporting requirements. Our go live date is April 11th.

Foresters Financial

This memo recommends that the Board approve Foresters Financial as a 457 Retirement Plan vendor for Scappoose Fire District.

The District's current vendor is the Oregon Savings Growth Plan (OSGP). It has a balanced variety of good no-load funds plus an independent option, and visits upon request to provide financial investment classes. As the OSGP staff emphasize, they only offer education and not financial advice. This works well for individuals confident enough to make their own choices or who have a relationship with an external financial adviser.

However, employees today bear the primary responsibility for organizing an adequate long-term retirement and solving other financial concerns such as children's education, life insurance and long-term care. Many people require assistance with this, and employers can help by offering a vendor with more comprehensive services for those who choose to pay for it.

On March 9, eight staff met with Sara Rohne-Tanner, a Foresters Financial Services representative. Sara grew up in Knappa and has served many local governments and their employees for 25 years. Chief Greisen and I both have personal experience with her, and also know of her excellent reputation with many other investors. Where many other companies promise in-depth financial advising and then fade into the woodwork, Sara actually provides the service year after year. The staff who attended her presentation were impressed with the information she shared. Sara's contractual relationship with her clients adheres to a fiduciary standard which requires her to put her clients' interests above her own.

Foresters is an international financial services provider with \$28 billion of funds under management. It has been in business since 1930. It is an offshoot of the Independent Order of Foresters, a fraternal organization deeply committed to charitable works within the communities they serve. Foresters offers front load funds, and the onetime fees start at 5.5% and scale down from there as the client's asset balance increases. While this is expensive compared to the OSGP, Foresters provides comprehensive services that the OSGP cannot.
